Linear Expression

A project that shows an emotional reaction or opinion of an actual event interpreted into a Pen and Ink drawing.

New Terms/ Vocalenlary

- Contour drawing- A drawing that uses line to show only the contour of objects and their details
- Line- A point moving through space
- Line Quality- the differences in line (or: what a line looks like)
- Expressive Line- a line that conveys meaning or can be interpreted.

Learning Goals:

- 1. To be able to identify and change line quality throughout the drawing to evoke emotion or create expression.
- 2. To be able to use the new media (ink and pen or brush) correctly
- 3. Craftsmanship-The project is completed with due care and a presentable condition is maintained

Required Materials:

- 9"X12" sheet of newsprint paper
- 11"X14" sheet of Bristol Board
- India Ink
- Crow Quill ink pen

Project Steps:

- 1. Sketch a contour drawing on a piece of newsprint.
- 2. Alter (change) the contour drawing using expressive line that reflects your feelings about the article your group read.
- 3. Draw about a one inch border on a 9"X12" piece of Bristol Board.
- 4. Redraw your sketch lightly onto your sheet of Bristol Board . (be sure it uses the same expressive line as your sketch and that it is not too small.)
- 5. Draw over your pencil lines with india ink and pen or brush enhancing the line quality (thickness and thinness).
- 6. Add text to your drawing that relates to the article your group read
- 7. (This adds focus to your drawing and helps the viewer understand the expressive line.)
