Artist Information

- The information you find on your artist falls under three categories
 - » Introduction
 - Artist's Name
 - Art Movement
 - Date of Birth and Death
 - » Professional Information
 - Influences, subjects, and media
 - » Background Information
 - Friends, Family, and interesting details
 - » Conclusion

The book must have **COVERS** that are
CREATIVE.

The book must have **pop-outs**, **pockets**, and a **HAND-MADE duplicate** of the artist's work.

Book making rules

Follow the check list to ensure that you have all of the required information in your Recordion Book.

Project Grading

The project is graded on the following:

Research- all of the information must be present in the book to receive full credit.

- It is a good idea to use page titles and headings to indicate specific required information

Construction- Plan your book out early to allow space for the required pockets and pop-outs.

Appearance- The book must be creative, attractive, and appear in the artist's style to receive full credit.

- Review the list of available artists
- Write down a few of the names that might be interesting
- Look up the artists in the library for one that you find interesting
- Sign up for the artist you've chosen on the list for your class.
